	<p>I Can Make You Say 21 1st-3rd Grade - Try to get the other person to say the number "21" in this counting game that requires some strategic thinking. Beginning with 1, each player can choose to say the next 1, 2, or 3 numbers in order. The next person continues the counting sequence. The person that has to say "21" loses the game and gets to go first the next time!</p>	 <p>We Did it!</p>	
	<p>Buzz on 3 2nd-3rd Grade - This game practices skip counting by a specific number. If your "buzz number" is three, the first person says "One." The next person says, "Two". The third person says "Buzz!" since every third number is "buzzed." The sequence continues "four, five, buzz, seven, eight, buzz, etc." If a player accidentally says the number instead of "buzz," that player is out or the game begins again.</p>	 <p>We Did it!</p>	
	<p>Numbers on My Back K-1st Grade - Help your child learn to recognize and write numbers by taking turns tracing numbers on one another's backs using your finger. Start with one digit numbers 0-9. When your child is ready, try even bigger numbers like 12, 55, or 100!</p>	 <p>We Did it!</p>
